Are you moving elsewhere for 2023?

We are beginning to plan for 2023 classes. In order for us to be up-to-date with enrolments and staffing, we ask that families with students in Kindergarten to Year 5 who already know they will not be returning in 2023 to inform the school via phone call, note or email as soon as possible.

Kindergarten and Preschool 2023 Enrolments

We would like to start welcoming any enrolments into Kindergarten or Preschool for 2023. If your child turns 5 before 31st July 2023 you are able to request an enrolment application from the school office. All families within our school intake area will be accepted, provided all documentation is submitted. Families can also complete their initial enrolment application online via our school website at https://lansvale-p.schools.nsw.gov.au/

If your child does not live within our <u>intake area</u>, visit <u>out-of-area enrolment</u>. Out-of-area <u>enrolment procedures</u> are subject to the department's enrolment policy.



Children attending our preschool this year will still need to follow the same enrolment procedures if they wish to enrol at Lansvale Public School.

COVID-smart measures for schools

Information for parents, carers and students



We know that being together in the classroom is the best thing for our students' learning, growth and welfare. This term we will continue to implement several measures to allow us to prioritise both the wellbeing of our students and a consistent and productive learning environment.



Stay home if unwell

- If your child is unwell, you must keep them at home. If they are displaying COVID-19 symptoms, they should take a COVID-19 test (PCR or RAT) and follow the advice from the NSW Government on managing COVID-19 safely at home.
- · Your child should only return to school when they are symptom free.



Vaccinations

- . Vaccinations for COVID-19 and other viral illnesses are one of the best ways of protecting yourself, your family and the community. Vaccination is a safe and effective way to give your immune system a helping hand against many illnesses.
- · All eligible students and staff are strongly encouraged to keep up to date with their vaccinations to protect their health.
- All staff working in schools for specific purposes (SSPs) are required to be double vaccinated against COVID-19 or hold a valid medical contraindication.



Rapid antigen testing

- Rapid antigen tests (RATs) should be used if your child is displaying COVID-19 symptoms.
- . Students who test positive to COVID-19 are encouraged to notify their school and register their positive test results with Service NSW to have access to timely advice and support from NSW Health.
- Schools will maintain a reserve stock of rapid antigen tests onsite for surveillance testing purposes in the event of an outbreak.



Hygiene and cleaning

- · Students are encouraged to regularly wash their hands with soap and warm water, and to use personal
- Boosted day cleaning of schools will continue on high-touch areas and other hard surfaces, door handles, lockers, light switches and handrails in stairways.

Ventilation

- Fresh air is the most effective form of ventilation to minimise the risk of transmission.
- . During the warmer months, cooling will be used together with ventilation methods to balance thermal
- All learning spaces in government schools have been checked to ensure appropriate levels of ventilation and air purifiers have been provided where needed.
- . Using outdoor spaces will continue to be encouraged where possible.



- . Mask-wearing is strongly encouraged where possible for all students, staff and visitors, particularly indoors and/or when physical distancing is not possible, and if they have been exposed to COVID-19.
- Mask-wearing is required at all times for staff, volunteers and other workers who support our students
 who are at greater risk of serious illness should they contract COVID-19, whether they be in schools for specific purposes (SSPs), support units or mainstream classroom



Visitors

- · Visitors can attend school sites regardless of their vaccination status.
- Visitors who are engaging directly with students in certain higher-risk settings for school operations and curriculum delivery and allied health partners for the wellbeing of students, may be required to



Activities

- · Health and safety risk assessments will be integrated when planning activities, including excursions and overnight camps.
- · Parents and carers will be made aware of the risk of exposure and will need to give permission for certain activities.



Responding to local situations

- . Schools will work with the department's Health, Safety and Staff Wellbeing case management team to respond appropriately to local situations, including outbreaks of viral illness.
- . In some cases, schools may temporarily introduce additional measures as a 'circuit breaker', including requiring mask-wearing, postponing or limiting non-essential activities and directing cohorts to learn remotely.



Learning remotely

 Schools continue to have access to digital, guided and printed learning resources to support students who need to learn remotely.

Teachers at Lansvale Public School consistently attend professional learning to hone their teaching skills to cater for their students' needs.

This past week various groups of teachers have taken part in professional learning in the areas of the Creative Arts, Autism Spectrum Disorder and guided reading using decodables. Miss Su and Miss Hoang upskilled our teachers in music and visual arts on Tuesday afternoon. Their engaging session could be heard well outside the walls of our school hall! In fact, you could occasionally hear them in the library where another group of teachers were learning about how to cater for students on the Autism Spectrum. This was facilitated by the Fairfield Assistant Principal Learning and Support, Terina Hamilton.

Yesterday, a group of brave Kindergarten students demonstrated their reading skills to our Kindergarten, Year 1 and 2 teachers in the APC&I room. Teachers observed what components of English are covered in a guided reading session. Our wonderful kindergarten students did their teachers proud! They read unfamiliar books, discussed the contents of the book as well showcased their ability to spell unfamiliar words using their knowledge of phonics.
