Lansvale Lionhearts continues this fortnight, each Friday, during the middle session. This week, students continued to develop relationships through fun games and started to learn about bullying. The teachers unpacked what bullying is to ensure that students understood the term. Bullying can be defined by Kids Helpline as "Being mean to someone over and over again" and the session outlined the different types of bullying that a person might face. Students also participated in an activity where they bullied a piece of paper. Sounds crazy, right? However, this activity taught the students to understand that bullying can cause hurt and pain that could last a lifetime.

The Kids Helpline is a great resource for students as it assists students to navigate through the challenges of life such as bullying. Phew! What a big fortnight with 3 class visits. Luckily, I had my walking shoes on because I was everywhere.

My first stop was to our eldest students, with a visit to the vibrant class, 6T. In this class, I shared a book recommended to me by Mrs Chau, 'Penguin Problems' by Jory John. This book is about a penguin who is constantly complaining about his life and there are some funny moments. The class seemed to enjoy the book and we all had a good laugh. If you have not read this yet, I highly recommend.



Next, I stopped into class 5N to share a book that touches on the importance of online safety. The title of this book is 'The Fabulous Friend Machine,' by popular children's author Nick Bland. It is a cautionary tale of what can happen online when we chat to people that we do not actually know. The students were able to connect this story to real life dangers and were able to communicate the need for safe behaviours online.



Finally, I had the pleasure of visiting 3H to read a book that I have fond memories of from my childhood, 'When the Wind Changed,' by Australian author Ruth Park. The students enjoyed watching the boy, Josh, in the story pull all sorts of weird and wonderful faces as he went about his day. If only Josh had listened when his father

told him what would happen when the wind changed! If you have not yet experienced this book, I would also suggest grabbing this Australian classic- it is a real crowd pleaser!

Maths Talk with 3MB and Red or Black with KL

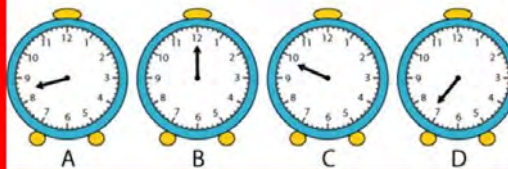
What a delight it was to play *Red or Black* with Kindergarten! Playing with KL was quite different to playing it with 4S, for one thing, they were a lot quieter! The students in KL were learning to count forward for any given number up to 20. Using a number line, students kept track of their score. Students' one-to-one correspondence and numeral identification has improved so much! The game *Red or Black* involved guessing whether a card was red or black. If students guessed it correctly, they could move their counter forward. The first to 20 wins! If you would like to play this at home, I highly encourage you to ask students to add it up in their heads first or use their fingers to encourage additive thinking strategies.

In 3MB, I was fortunate enough to have not only 3MB students but also some 3H students on the day. We completed a maths talk based on time. Students in Year 3 have been learning to read an analog clock in class. The task was to look at a "broken" clock where the minute hand was missing and work out what Mrs Brown might be doing at that time. Students reasoning of what time it was based on the location of the hour hand was so wonderful to see. They also understood that unlike a digital clock, they didn't know whether it was am or pm, so they had to think of things Mrs Brown could be doing in the morning and evening. Take a look below at the problem and have a discussion with your children at home.

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Preschool Newsletter Week 7

Gu Zheng -Chinese Harp with Bethany's mum.

Last week, we had Bethany's mum bring in a very special instrument to share with the children- her Gu Zheng, which is a Chinese harp instrument. The children had a great time, dancing and playing games while learning mathematical concepts at the same time. The children danced to 5 cheeky monkeys, sang along to twinkle twinkle little star before they moved like the animal that the sound of the Gu Zheng made. The children also made groups of a given number when the sound of the Gu Zheng stopped. They also learnt to tap and clap to the rhythm and beat before everyone had a turn playing the strings of the Gu Zheng.



Recycling

Our Environmentally conscious learners are still exploring recycling. They are in the process of making their own paper. They have spent the week working very hard to cut the paper from our recycling bin into tiny pieces. They will then add water before mixing it and placing it onto a screen. They are also using ICT to create images of all the trees that need to be cut down in order for paper to be made. Our children are now more determined than ever to recycle their paper scraps to ensure our animals don't lose their homes.



Numeracy

Numeracy continues to be a big focus inside and outside our preschool classrooms. We have been building the children's number sense by encouraging them to represent numbers in different ways. We have added numbers in our mud kitchen recipes for the children to practise counting and making quantities when they are cooking.





Recycled Crafts- Robots and Aeroplanes

The children are continuously learning how to incorporate their creativity and imagination into our sustainability craft projects. This includes making robots and aeroplanes using old food packaging that has been donated from our wonderful families. This allows them to use play to investigate, explore and project new ideas by resourcing their learning and connecting with these recycled resources.



Active Beginnings Fun Fit for Kids

The children showed lots of excitement as they participated in Active Beginnings on Mondays and Wednesdays where they focused on locomotor movements, balance, coordination and teamwork. Throughout the program, the children constantly cheered the mantra "I can do it!" which motivated them to keep trying their best, building on their sense of persistence and achievements.



Year 3 Gardening Club Bunnings Excursion

The Year 3 Gardening Club has begun the first of many excursions and incursions with Bunnings Warehouse, Villawood. They travelled by minibus with Mrs Paulic and Mrs Tran to Bunnings on Wednesday 24th August. When they got there, they went to the workshop that was set up for them and each student was given a Bunnings apron. They painted some terracotta pots that they will plant some flowers in, hammered some nails into caddies for their gloves and tools and were spoilt with Bunnings Lego!

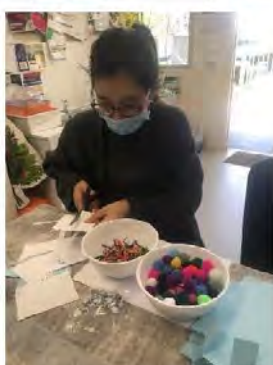

Communication milestones



Children learn to communicate by interacting with carers, early childhood educators, and their peers.

A child's communication development is everyone's responsibility. Speech pathologists can support children (and those who care for them) to build communication, and make sure children are developing "between the flags".

We can work together to

- find out which children are understanding and speaking "between the flags"
- create communication-supporting learning spaces
- help children with a range of communication needs.

Speech pathologists can also provide therapy to help children with

- understanding and using pictures, symbols, signs, gestures, speech sounds, words and sentences
- taking turns and making eye contact
- building skills for later reading and spelling
- stuttering, voice and feeding difficulties.

Don't "wait and see"

Please speak to parents about their child's communication as soon as you have any concerns. Get advice from Speech Pathology Australia by phoning 1300 368 835.

Work together with a speech pathologist in your area. You can contact speech pathologists:

- through local community health centres and not-for-profit organisations
- by calling or emailing private practices.

Try searching for speech pathology services online, or at www.speechpathologyaustralia.org.au (click on 'Find a Speech Pathologist').

Language and cultural differences

Children from different backgrounds, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander backgrounds, may use words differently when learning English. This may not be a problem. Always encourage families to use the language(s) at home that they are comfortable speaking.

Regardless of whether English is a child's first language, ALL children need meaningful language experiences through stories, music, nursery rhymes, play and LOTS of repetition. If you're unsure about their progress, check with a speech pathologist.

At 12 months children can usually...

- understanding**
- understand about 10 words
 - respond to their name
 - recognise greetings and gestures, such as 'hi' and 'bye-bye'
 - recognise a few familiar people and objects (e.g., mummy, blankie, teddy)
 - make eye contact.

When you talk to me, WAIT for me to respond before you say more.

- speaking**
- start to use sounds, gestures, and say a few words
 - continue to babble
 - copy different sounds and noises.



At 18 months children can usually...

- understanding**
- understand up to 50 words and some short phrases
 - follow simple instructions (e.g., 'throw the ball')
 - point to familiar objects when named
 - point to some pictures in familiar books.

Get face-to-face with me when we communicate.

- speaking**
- say 6 to 20 single words – some easier to understand than others, but becoming more consistent
 - copy lots of words and noises
 - name a few body parts
 - use objects in pretend play (e.g., hold toy phone to their ear and say 'hello?').



At 3 years children can usually...

- understanding**
- follow more complex two part instructions (e.g., give me the teddy and throw the ball)
 - understand simple wh-questions, such as 'what', 'where' and 'who'
 - understand the concepts of 'same' and 'different'
 - sort items into groups when asked (e.g., toys vs food)
 - recognise some basic colours.

Figure out what I want to say, and put it into words for me.

- speaking**
- say four to five words in a sentence
 - use a variety of words for names, actions, locations and descriptions
 - ask questions using 'what', 'where' and 'who'
 - talk about something in the past, but may use '-ed' a lot (e.g., 'he goed there')
 - have a conversation, but may not take turns or stay on topic.



At 4 years children can usually...

- understanding**
- answer most questions about daily tasks
 - understand most wh-questions, including those about a story they have recently heard
 - understand some numbers
 - show an awareness that some words start or finish with the same sounds.

No need to always read the whole book. Talk about pictures that interest me.

- speaking**
- use words, such as 'and', 'but' and 'because', to make longer sentences
 - describe recent events, such as morning routines
 - ask lots of questions
 - use personal pronouns (e.g., he/she, me/you) and negations (e.g., don't/can't)
 - count to five and name a few colours.



At 2 years children can usually...

- understanding**
- follow simple two part instructions (e.g., 'give me the ball and the car')
 - respond to simple wh-questions, such as 'what' and 'where'
 - point to several body parts and pictures in books when named
 - understand when an object is 'in' and 'on' something.

- speaking**
- say more than 50 single words
 - put two words together (e.g., 'bye teddy', 'no ball')
 - use their tone of voice to ask a question (e.g., 'teddy go?')
 - say 'no' when they do not want something
 - use most vowel sounds and a variety of consonants (m, n, p, b, k, g, h, w, t, d)
 - start to use 'mine' and 'my'.



At 5 years children can usually...

- understanding**
- follow three part instructions (e.g., put on your shoes, get your backpack and line up outside)
 - understand time related words (e.g., 'before', 'after', 'now' and 'later')
 - start thinking about the meaning of words when learning
 - understand instructions without stopping to listen
 - begin to recognise some letters, sounds and numbers.

- speaking**
- use well formed sentences to be understood by most people
 - take turns in increasingly longer conversations
 - tell simple, short stories with a beginning, middle and end
 - use past and future verbs correctly (e.g., 'went', 'will go')
 - use most speech sounds, but still may have difficulties with 's', 't', 'l' and 'th'.
