
If your child does not live within our intake area, visit out-of-area enrolment. Out-of-area enrolment procedures are subject to the department's enrolment policy. Enrol Now

We completed our body parts lesson where the children learnt the names of the male and female body parts. We spoke about it being private and that no one has the right to touch and photograph their private parts.






Letters to Santa

Year 5 Literacy and Numeracy Groups Mrs Stamoulis

My Year 5 Literacy groups were designed to enhance fundamental reading skills and to elevate comprehension to new heights. Students were learning about inferential reading, a crucial skill that goes beyond the surface of the text. It involves making connections, drawing conclusions, and understanding how to read between the lines. I have been guiding students through thought-provoking texts, encouraging them to explore characters' motivations, analyse plot developments and make predictions based on evidence. Through engaging discussions and activities, my Year 5 students improved in reading comprehension.


During my Numeracy groups, my Year 5 students became better mathematicians through the exploration of additive strategies. They understood that mathematics is not just about numbers but also about problem-solving and critical thinking. From hands-on activities to interactive problem-solving sessions, my students developed their addition and subtraction skills.



Additive strategies in Numeracy

🖴 I have loved working with Year 3 and Year 4 students in term 3 for Numeracy. 🖴 Our wonderful mathematicians have been making remarkable progress so far, all focusing on using a range of addition and subtraction strategies to solve 2 and 3-digit problems. Warm-up and cool-down games are a regular feature, which always allows the students to practise their skills mentally.

In term 3, students have been mastering flexible and efficient methods such as levelling, constant difference and regrouping. The students seem to think these strategies are superpowers with how easy they are to use! It was amazing to see so many students progress in solving a range of additive problems. I am so proud of these clever learners for always displaying such great enthusiasm and diligence towards their development in mathematics.







Numeracy Groups with Mrs Narli

This semester, stage 1 and 2 students developed their knowledge of flexible strategies when solving addition and subtraction problems involving 2- and 3-digit numbers. During the sessions, students selected cards to generate their own numbers, which is important for developing their mathematical understanding. This helped boost student engagement, enhancing their overall learning experience. Overall, I am incredibly proud of the remarkable progress that the students in my numeracy groups have made.



Mason learned to add and subtract tens numbers by counting by 10s. He utilised a number line to assist him in counting both forwards and backwards by 10s on the decade, identifying which digit changes and understanding the reasons behind it.



Selena investigated adding and subtracting tens numbers, bridging to 100. She demonstrated her understanding of this strategy using place value, allowing her to avoid counting by 10s.



Jessica investigated the addition and subtraction of decade numbers and 2- and 3-digit numbers by counting by 10s off the decade. She used her own cards and was able to demonstrate her understanding of this strategy.



Alicia investigated adding and subtracting decade numbers and 2- and 3-digit numbers, bridging to 100, using her own cards. She used place value and a number line to solve problems, allowing her to avoid counting by 10s.

<u>From Mrs</u> Allen



During Term 4, Year 1 students have been using Decodable Texts to read for fluency and comprehension. Reading Groups happen four times a week in the classrooms with a small group of children, usually three or four per group. They have been reading fictional and non-fictional texts.

Children learn many reading strategies like re-reading after a correction, sounding out difficult words, finding little words in an unfamiliar word or partitioning the word into chunks.

After they have read the text individually or as a group, they are asked comprehension questions to make sure they have understood the text.

Writing a sentence or two after the lesson, helps them monitor their spelling and punctuation.

No matter what level of reading the children are at, they enjoy this activity...











Sometimes children are recorded reading a few pages from their text and this is posted on Seesaw, so parents and teachers can listen to them and note their progress.











These children planted seedlings in our garden after reading a book on gardening.









After harvesting the produce, we made vegetable fritters and wrote out the recipe. We then sold fritters to the teachers to raise money for new seedlings.




