Unacceptable behaviour may include but is not limited to:


- · Aggressive or intimidating actions, such as violence, threatening gestures or physical proximity.



About Molly Kelly

Molly Kelly was a Aboriginal person who was apart of The Stolen Generation. She was born 1917 at Jigalong and died in January 2004. Sh believed to be 14 when she was taken away.


She is well known and familiar for escaping the Moore Park Native Settlement, when she was aggressively taken away from her family. She escaped with 2 of her relatives, her step sister Daisy Kadibil and her cousin Gracie Cross. To get away Molly and her 2 relatives needed to go on a long, difficult walk to their home which was 1600km away.

Later in her life she met a Aboriginal stockmen named Toby Kelly who she married, they both worked in the same job together. Molly had 2 children Doris and Annabelle, her and her daughters were taken away to the settlement. She escaped with her daughter Annabelle while carry her, while leaving a daughter Doris with a relative of hers. The government taken Annabelle from Molly in 1943 and Annabelle was told that she see her again. Doris got to see Molly again many years later.

Her famous story inspired the film "Rabbit Proof fence", made in Febuary 2002. She then died in 2004, January



All about Molly Kelly

Molly Kelly was a Aboriginal women and Molly Kelly was known to escape from the Moore River Native settlement. In 1981 Molly Kelly walk 1,600 km to get back from her home with her half sister Daisy Kadibil and couisn Gracie

Molly Kelly was from the Stolen Generation where children was forced to be removed from their families by the government.

She made a book called 'The Rabbit Proof Fence' and there is a movie about the book also Molly Kelly got admired from the stolen

Soon, Gwoya became the first Aboriginal to be on a postage stamp of which, sold over 99 million copies but then was removed after Gwoya's death. Because of this, Gwoya now remains on the \$2 dollar coin

Positive bedtime routines for school-age children

Bedtime routines help school-age children fall asleep. At this age, your child might be more independent with things like brushing their teeth, but they'll probably still enjoy quiet play, reading, gentle chat and cuddles with you as part of their bedtime routine.

Even as your child becomes more independent or starts to have a later bedtime, it's still a good idea for them to have a bedtime routine.

Here's an example of a bedtime routine for a school-age child:


- Your child does homework before dinner if they can, so that they can relax before bed.
- Your child has a bath or shower.
- Your child spends time doing relaxing things like drawing, listening to music or playing a game. Your child is likely to get to sleep more quickly if they avoid screens in the hour before bed.
- · You and your child share a story in bed. You can read to your child or ask your child to read to you.
- You and your child have a cuddle and a kiss goodnight.
- You or your child turns out the light.


Deep breathing for sleep relaxation







At bedtime, get your child to relax their shoulders. Ask your child to breathe in for 4 counts (count, '1 rabbit, 2 rabbits, 3 rabbits, 4 rabbits'). Ask your child to hold the breath in for 4 counts.



Ask your child to breathe out for 4 counts. Ask your child to hold the breath out for 4 counts. Repeat up to 4 times. Tell your child that deep breathing gets easier with daily practice.




