
Class 1 Shark Bay

Books with Mrs H.



Books with Mrs H is going strong! I had a lot of fun sharing the book 'Mopoke' by Philip Bunting with 2L. A mopoke is the Australian nickname for the Southern Bookbook, our smallest and most common species of owl. Mopokes are known for loving peace and quiet and for their well-known 'mo-poke' call. After the book, we listened to the sound that the Southern Boobooks make on the internet. We all agreed that we could hear the sound 'mo-poke' in their bird call.

I also visited Mrs Bui's Vietnamese Kindergarten class and boy; did I have some fun! Mrs Bui and I shared the reading of the book, 'A Dark, Dark Tale,' by Ruth Brown as it is written in both English and Vietnamese. I remember my teacher reading this book to me when I was in primary school, and I loved it. The book itself, is rich in atmosphere and mood, with Ruth Brown creating a suspenseful read



as a black cat navigates its way around a shadowy woods and house. After the book, Mrs Bui turned off the lights and we made our way through our dark, dark classroom to look in the dark, dark cupboard... how fun!

I also visited class KH to share a book that related to Harmony Day, Called, 'Everybody' by Elise Gravel. The book shares the ideas that everybody has strengths, flaws, feelings, ideas and needs. Everybody is unique and different, but we are all more similar than we think! KH agreed that they all had similarities and differences and these differences should all be celebrated as these are what makes life interesting!





Finally, I visited class 5V to explore some books by amazing Australian artist, Jeannie Baker. The class had recently read the books, 'Window' and 'Mirror' and were keen to explore more of her work. I brought in the book, 'Belonging' which tells the story of an urban landscape which over time becomes a place to call home with the inhabitants re-greening their city. The students loved examining the beautifully constructed collages on each page and discussing the differences they noticed from page to page.

Check-in Assessment Year 4 & 6

The Check-in Assessment will be held in the library for students in Years 4 & 6, from Week 4 to Week 7. Check-in assessments are online assessments in Reading and Numeracy. They are mapped to NSW Syllabus documents and the National Literacy and Numeracy Progressions. Each assessment is designed to be quick and easy to administer, consisting of between 40 to 50 multiple choice questions. There is no need for students to prepare for this assessment.

Art Wellbeing Mentor

This year, we have a new initiative called our Art Wellbeing Mentor sessions. Mr Malcom Fry, experienced primary teacher and local artist is teaching these sessions each Tuesday and Wednesday to enhance engagement across the school. Mr Fry also teaches art sessions in our preschool and collaborates beautifully with our Aboriginal Education Mentor to facilitate sessions with our Aboriginal students. He also targets our High Potential and Gifted Education students with lessons that build on their natural abilities. Our Art expression groups, from Kindergarten to Year 6, support our students with diverse learning needs to connect with each other and build on their social skills and self-esteem. NAP-Science Literacy

On Monday May 8th, some students in Year 6 were chosen to trial the NAP-Science Literacy test for ACARA. Around 12 000 Year 6 and 10 students from 640 schools were randomly chosen to take part in the trial. The test consisted of a series of multiple-choice questions, as well as some open-ended questions that required the students to explain their answers in more detail. The questions covered a range of topics, including biology, physics, and chemistry. After the test was completed, the students were given the opportunity to provide feedback on their experience. They were asked to share their thoughts on the test as well as Science in general. A public report on the results of the science literacy assessment will be released in 2024, and will document achievement in relation to the defined national proficiency levels. No individual student or school results will be published.

Maths with Mrs Chau

I joined 4 Havelka and 1 Tilba for their Maths lessons and thoroughly enjoyed the students explain their mathematical thinking. The students in 1 Tilba were very enthusiastic when I entered the room; eager to demonstrate their knowledge of number bonds. I worked with Lex, Denzel and Eric on their number bonds using unifix cubes. We discussed how we would know we have all the number bonds for particular numbers. Lex was particularly excited to show what he knew about the number 4.





The Maths lesson in 4 Havelka was focused on angles in the environment. Miss Hoang asked them to identify different angles around the room, such as the corners of the desks and the edges of the whiteboard. In groups, students identified right angles and angles smaller and larger than a right angle.

To challenge them, I gave them an open ended problem with an irregular shape and asked what angles do you see? How many right angles are there? Which angles are smaller than a right angle and which ones were larger? It was wonderful to hear students discuss their understanding and reasoning.












