




Concert 2023

Class 1Tilba



Attendance Reminders

This term, our school has implemented a range of incentives to celebrate, recognise and promote daily attendance. The students are really excited about this and can clearly articulate why coming to school is important and why it is equally as important to school on time (9:00am). Students are rewarded with;

- Randomly drawn canteen vouchers for 100% weekly attendance
- Whole class prizes if their class has regular, high attendance
- Termly attendance awards for 95%-100% attendance
- Whole school end of term attendance celebration (we had the ice cream truck to celebrate high attendance in Term 1).

We will continue to work with students and families to encourage daily attendance and ensure that we are promoting the high standard of at least **95% attendance** each term and across the whole year.

A friendly reminder to keep children at home if they are not well. Unfortunately, we all fall ill at certain times during the year and it is always best to stay at home to rest and ensure that we are doing our best to minimise the spread.

The visual below displays the percentages of attendance and the weeks and days of learning missed. For example, if we are all aiming for 95% attendance, the 5% of time that we are not school adds up to nearly 2 full weeks of missed learning. This is a lot of valuable time which is missed! We emphasise the importance of 'Every Day Counts' as a couple of days off per term all adds up.

It was such a rich and engaging experience as the students got to get up close with many animals they had never seen before, order their lunches from the cafeteria, navigate the Zoo's map, as well as help direct Mrs Fereday as she drove the school bus. It was such a fun-filled day that many of the students fell asleep on the way home! The students have been working on interest-based projects related to their zoo experience. Many teachers have been able to view some of their outstanding zoo writing which is on display in the front office. We are very proud of the exceptional manners which all students displayed whilst they were visiting the zoo.



From Mrs Lu

There are some Marvellous Mathematicians in 3 Harding! I visited them to see their work in problem solving and addition and subtraction. Students were using a range of strategies including bridging, levelling and compensation.

In Year 3, students are learning to use a different mental and written strategies when solving 2 and 3-digit problems. How many different ways could you solve 78 + 89?



Visiting Year 4 Chinese RFF with Mrs Zheng was a wonderful experience for me and I even learnt how to speak Mandarin! They were teaching me the names of different ball games and verbs associated with playing them. Do you know what this means?

At Lansvale Public School, we embrace our cultural diversity and acknowledge the importance of allowing students to maintain their home language by offering Language classes including Chinese, Vietnamese and Khmer.



I had the pleasure of visiting 1Noosa to see them during Mathematics - my favourite subject!

1 Noosa have settled so well with their new teacher Mrs Henry.

To review prior learning, students were confidently counting different arrangements by 2s which made it quicker to reach the total than counting by 1s!



Next, they solved problems involving length (how long or short something is) by carefully reading through the question and seeing which option was correct.

Finally, they got to work with adding and subtracting by using their knowledge of number lines, partitioning, number bonds and place value! Keep up the great work 1 Noosa!



Maths with Mrs Chau

I had the privilege of visiting 2 Dingo and 5 Juukan for mathematics. Both classes were using various strategies to add and subtract numbers. In Year 5, students were adding and subtracting 3-digit numbers. Tarkan and Julius were enthusiastic students who were eager to hear the various ways a number problem could be solved. I loved how they questioned why I preferred one strategy over another and explained why they preferred various methods. They gained a better understanding of levelling and why and when it was useful.

I also worked with some bright Year 2 students who were adding and subtracting two 2-digit numbers in their heads! They then demonstrated what their brain was thinking in their books. It was amazing to see Kaylani, Luca and Katrina so articulate when they explained their methods. Their rationale for their strategies was amazing to hear. We ended the lesson with the game 101 and out. They were so excited that they have invited me back to come and play with them!

Thank you 5 Juukan and 2 Dingo for such a warm welcome in your classrooms.








Yoga




National Sorry Day




